



**Touchwood Trees
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Touchwood regenerate and transform public spaces; both urban and rural, to create healthy and diverse environments that are culturally stimulating, educational, and that function in providing habitat richness and aesthetic value.

We specialise in accessible public and community artworks, producing wooden sculptures and furniture, murals and mosaics, landscaping and food gardens in cities, schools, hospitals and public parks, also galleries and unused spaces.

In all our work, we aim to involve those working with us in design and creation, so that the work truly reflects local aspirations and values. Social cohesion and collective values are represented through symbols at the centre of a community.

The raw materials for much of our work come from our woodland practice, which through dedicated management is a sustainable, renewable resource. The use of reclaimed and sustainable materials informs the nature of our work, leading to environmental issues and broad social concerns being addressed.

We have a vast experience of designing, organising and developing public art projects, working within budgets, and completing work on time. We are covered by public liability insurance up to £10m and we are CRB checked.

Amongst our qualified staff are; artists, construction specialists, gardeners; an HCPC registered Art Psychotherapist, qualified teachers and an arboriculturalist.

Touchwood's work centers round our relationship to land, its ownership and uses and the social and political implications therein. This has led to horticultural and therapeutic work with groups in educational settings as part of an exploration of landscape and garden creation that individuals and communities can benefit from materially and socially.

We aim to reclaim the social importance of public space and to facilitate contribution through collaboration and shared responsibility. Urban spaces and landscapes are shared cultural phenomena, and we aim to promote social experiences and interventions that reflect our common values and are a communion with a historic self. Where the audience's role is non-participatory we aim to convey a sense of engagement with the work through the concepts, processes and materials employed in construction.

We recognise managed landscape as the narrative that describes the relationship between people and the land and we seek to point to the physical reality of our lives; to create both a sense of wonder and urgency about our current situation on earth.

As part of the programme we completed an Iron Age Round House to facilitate forestry and education. We are now developing **Kent Garden Chronicles**, a rural heritage project, using the arts and ancient crafts to integrate history and contemporary farming and growing practices in the 21st century with refugee and immigrant groups, the elderly and youth groups.
